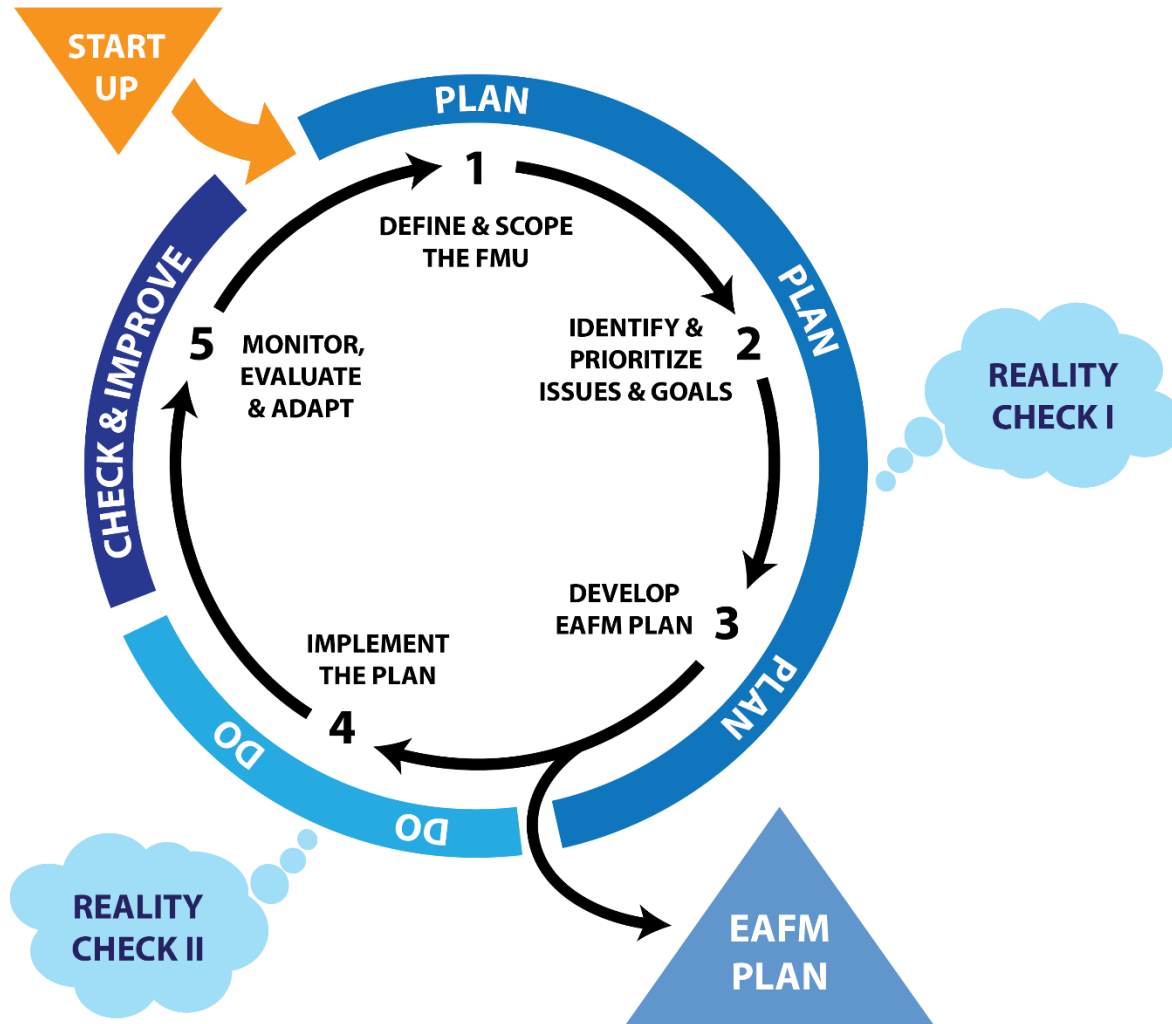

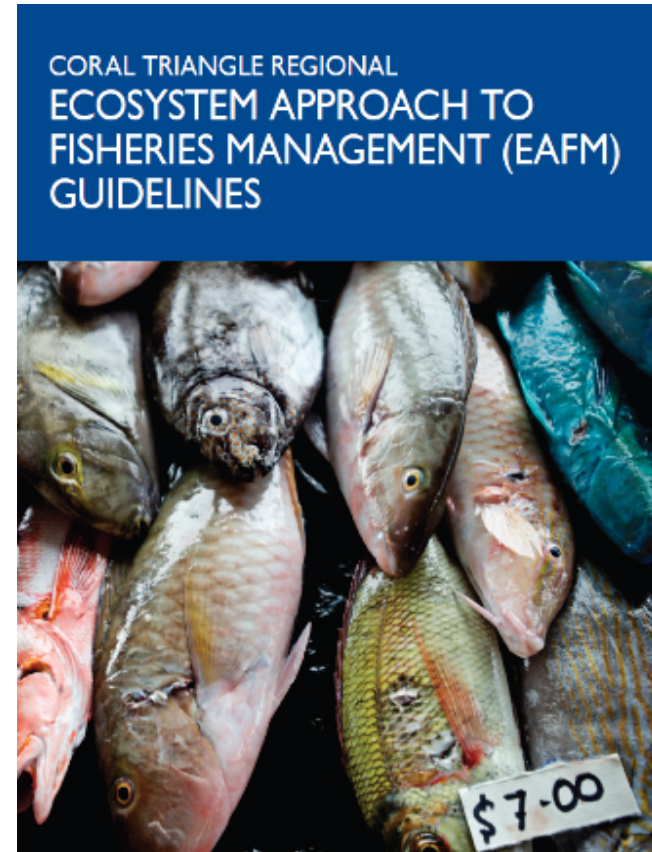

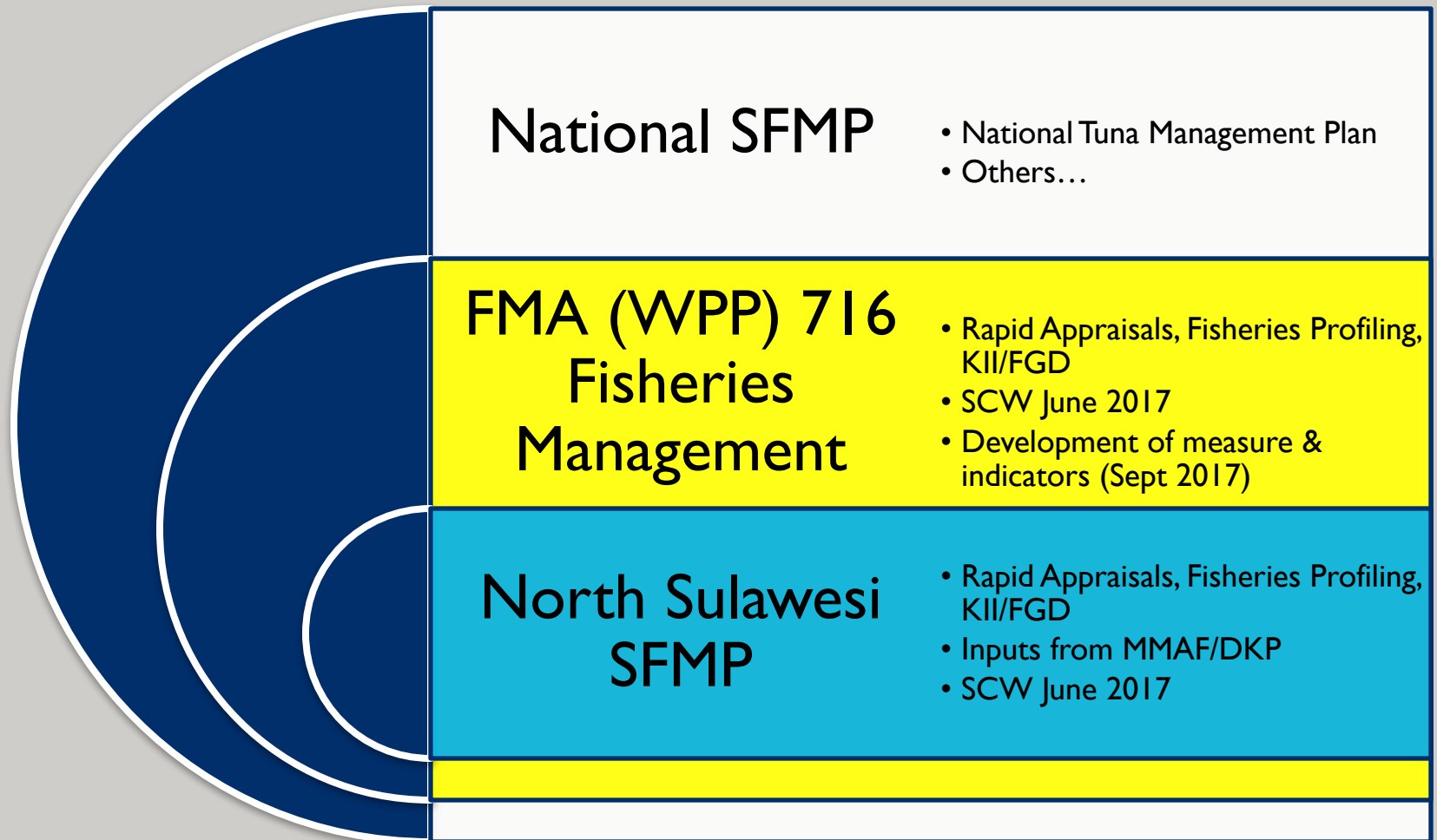

Example: Crafting of SFMP or EAFM Plan for Bitung Learning Site in North Sulawesi (Indonesia)

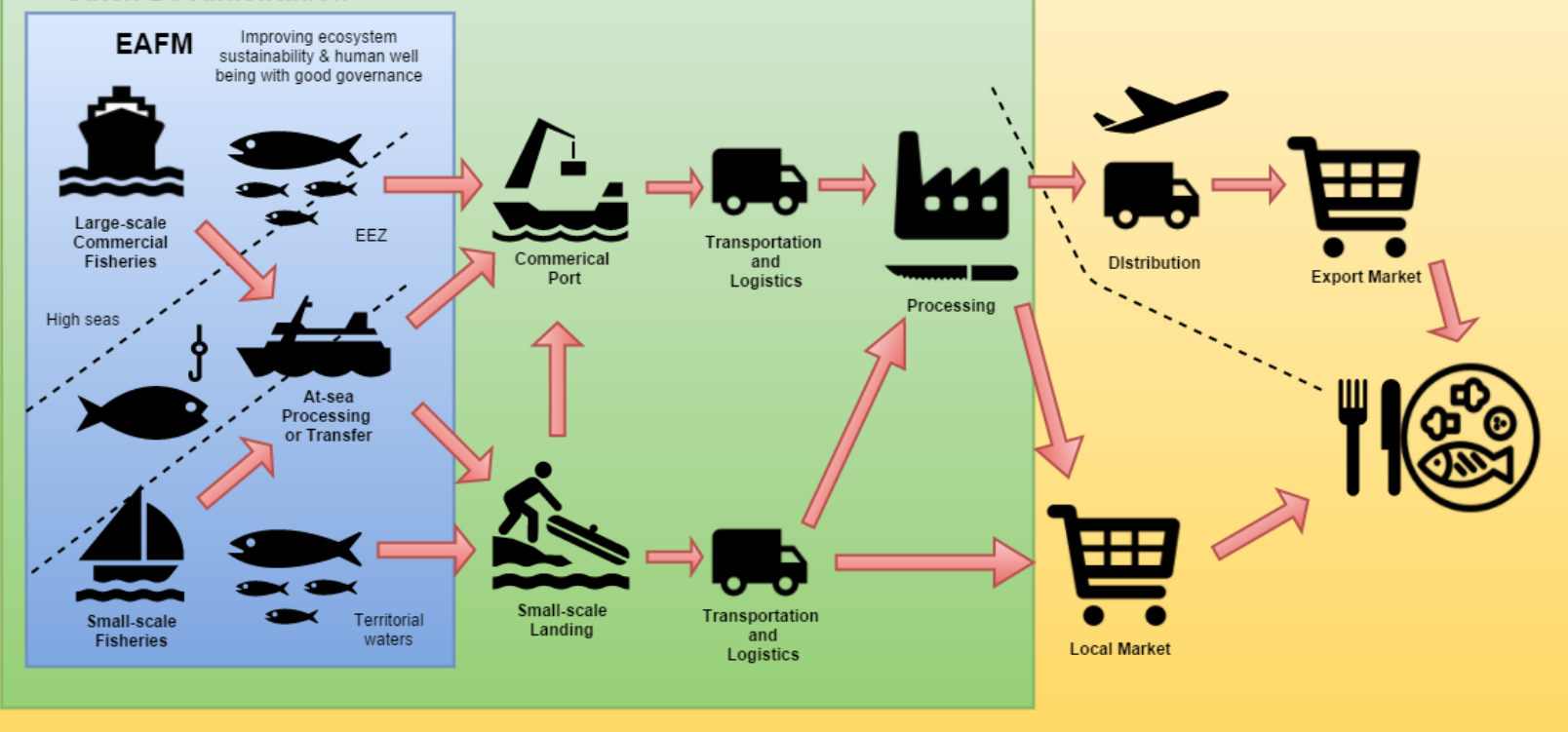

Catch Documentation Documenting catch, movement and processing

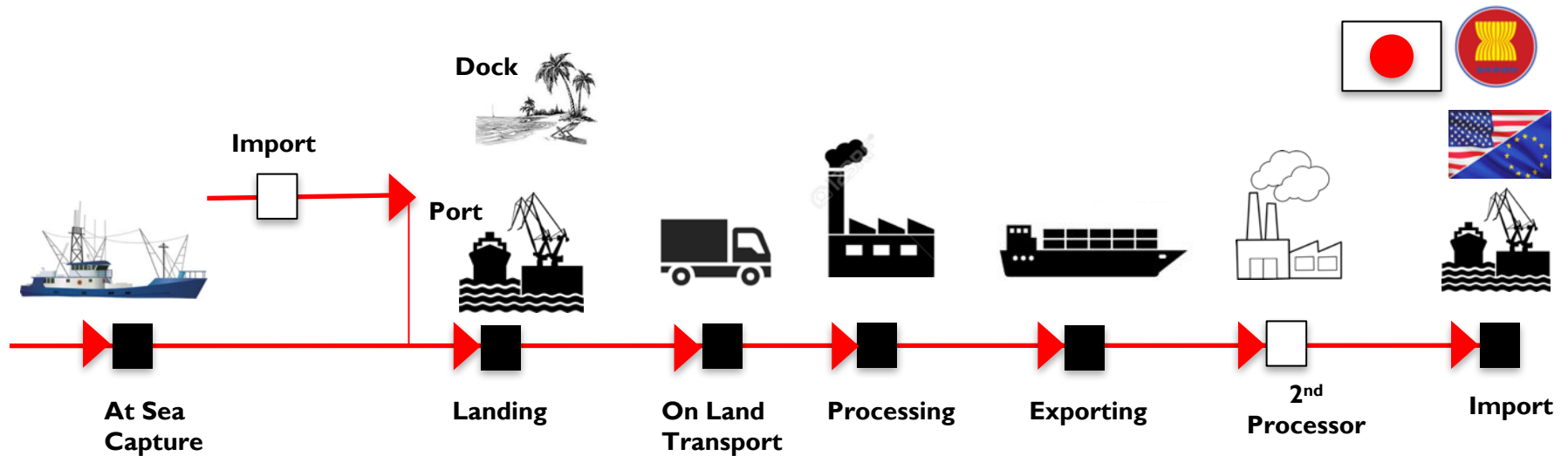

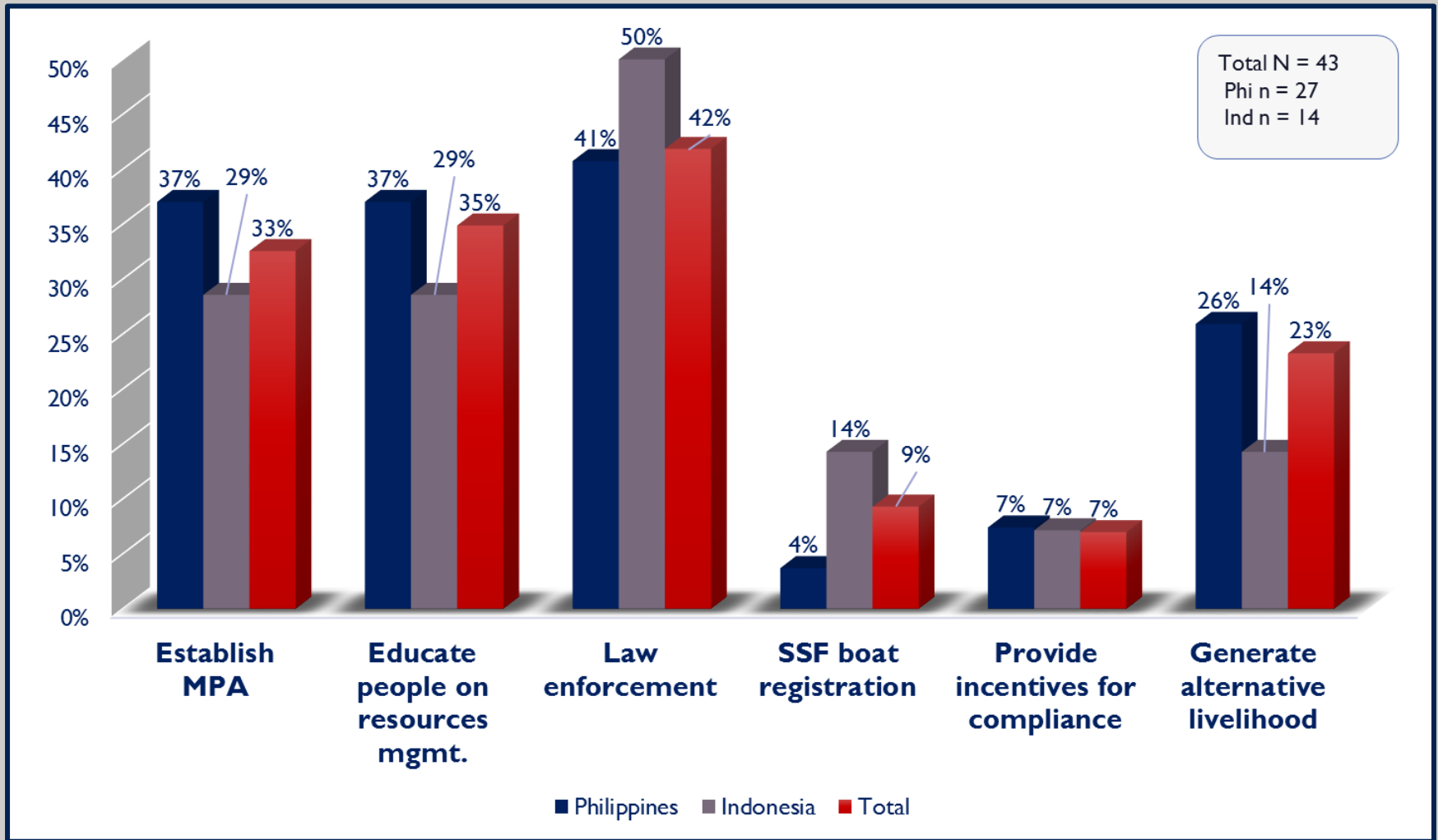

RECOMMENDATIONS

- Develop partnerships between national and local government and academic institutions at each learning site to demonstrate how to apply eCDT system data for fisheries management.
- Demonstrate proof of concept of DEX for integrating fisheries-related databases.



AHEAD IN 2018 - 2019

- EAFM support to CDTs implementation & testing
- Launch of grants with in Philippines and Indonesia to demonstrate the use of eCDT to strengthen fisheries management
- EAFM support to development of CDTs regional guidelines & gender policies
- Finalization and adoption of Sustainable Fisheries Management Plans (Sulu Sulawesi Sea EAFM Plan & learning site-based EAFM Plan) that incorporate CDT interventions
